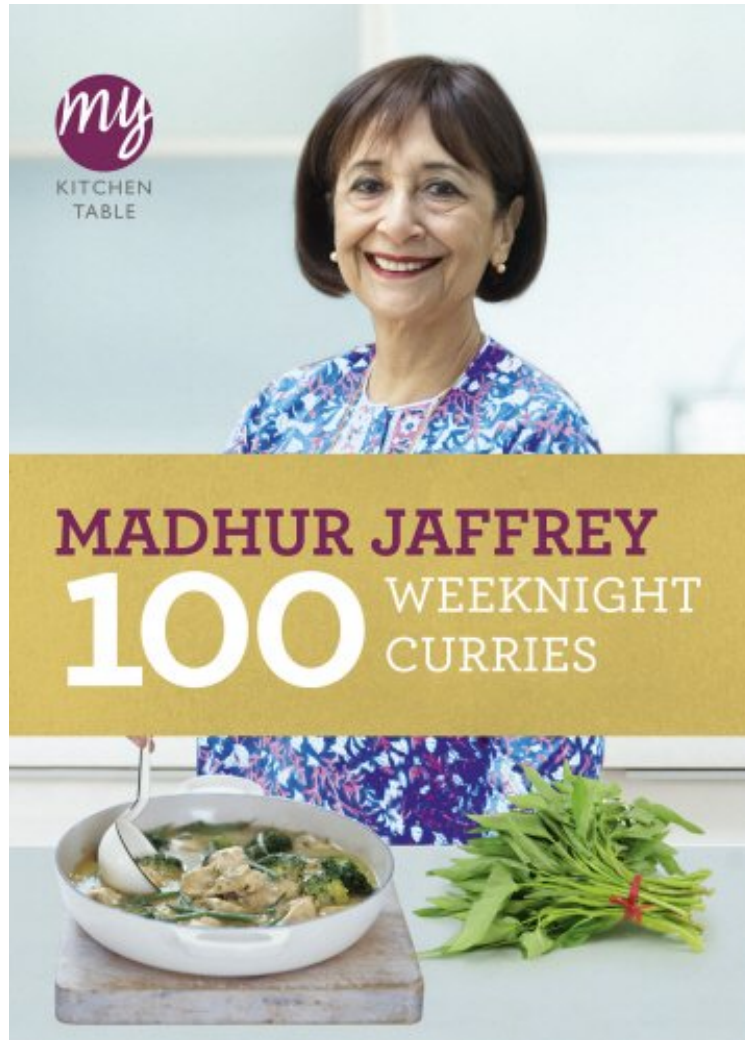

We've also given away three copies of the book to friends who like curry. Cooking Indian can be quite demanding, with the bewildering variety of spices to be ground, added and quickly toasted, but the recipes in this book are not overly fussy, and we've developed our own workflow, measuring all the spices in advance, and lining them up in little ramekins (some with multiple seasonings, that are added at the same time) ready for insertion. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful.
