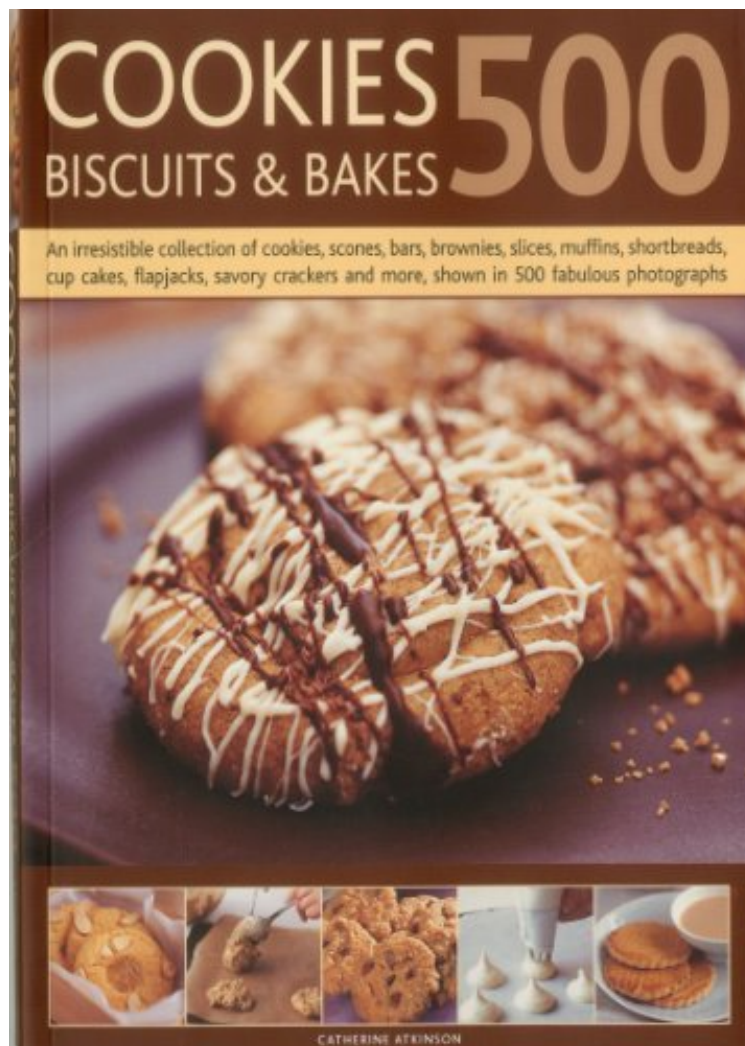

Not worth what I paid...wish I had bought a used copy on By DetailsFirst of all, this book may contain 500 photographs, but they are not anything close to "fabulous" as the cover states. Most of the photos are either poorly lit or just don't show off the cookies in a very flattering way. And they are all tiny. The recipes are also really confusing to follow. Each measurement is given first in grams, then ounces, then cup/TBS/tsp, etc. The print is SUPER tiny. So if you are in the middle of baking and need to quickly refer to a measurement, well, you can't. It's frustrating and could've been laid out much better. There are many recipes in this book that look intriguing (malt whisky truffles, triple chocolate sandwiches, and sun dried tomato butter crackers caught my eye), but there are some recipes that don't make sense. I can't recall exactly what one of the cookies is called, but the name is Cappuccino something...there are 2 TBS of coffee in it and nothing else that would make me think it was related to cappuccino. It's like the author tried too hard to give everything a super unique name. And really there are not 500 recipes, just lots of repeats of the same recipe with different flavors. The average person would be able to figure out it's ok to sub lemon for orange, or something like that, without needing to have a whole separate recipe listed.Overall this book was really disappointing and I did not buy it on so I paid a lot for it. I would not recommend it to a friend, and probably will not bake anything from it. If I do I'll have to either A. Use a magnifying glass, or B. Hand write the recipe in larger print with the measurements I'll use on a separate sheet of paper for reference. Big disappointment.
