I have just begun to read it and have fallen completely, irrevocably in love. I started reading it for the purpose of learning the grammar and vocabulary of blazoning - and will keep reading because I have come, after only a few pages, to love the author. Fox-Davies speaks about the art of heraldry in the particular, verbose, slightly-over-the-top style of someone who bears a humongous passion for that of which he writes. Hilariously, he is, for lack of a better term, a bit of a "complaining pants". He spends the introduction first chapter ranting about his issues with other heraldry books published at the time, and slips back into these rants often. You can feel his nerdy passion about his subject. The side effect of this is that sometimes the book is somewhat like watching paint dry. He goes on at such length he talks simply TOO much sometimes. However, the language he uses and his writing style make the experience more relaxing than boring. Your enjoyment of this book will depend entirely on your personality and interests - if you're simply trying to learn about the facts of heraldry but do not have a particular interest in history and/or vintage writing, this book is worth having to skip through, and use for reference. But if you, like me, love and find not just interest, but inner solace in Victorian writing styles, if you love history, and if you find joy in old fashioned humor and the almost adorable rants of a very passionate person, read this thing cover to cover.
