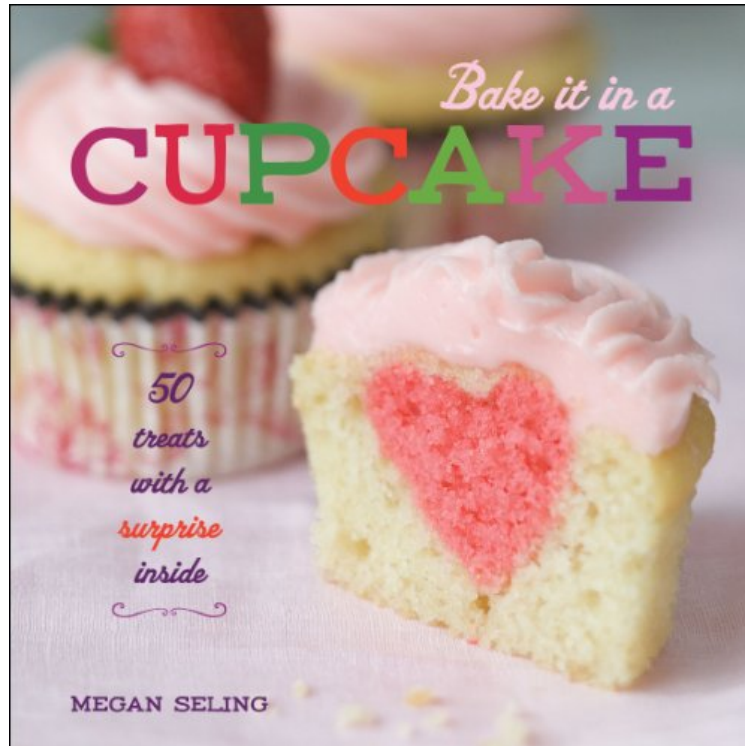

I was not a huge fan of the buttercream frosting recipes. I think the recipes were a little too heavy on the butter making it difficult to pipe the frosting. I like a shortening:butter frosting recipe myself. I think it allows for a consistency that is not only easier to pipe, but also holds up better and longer in warmer temperatures than a full butter recipe does. But the ideas and recipes for the actual cupcakes are absolutely fantastic!! You can always pick whatever type of frosting you want to top your cupcakes with later.
