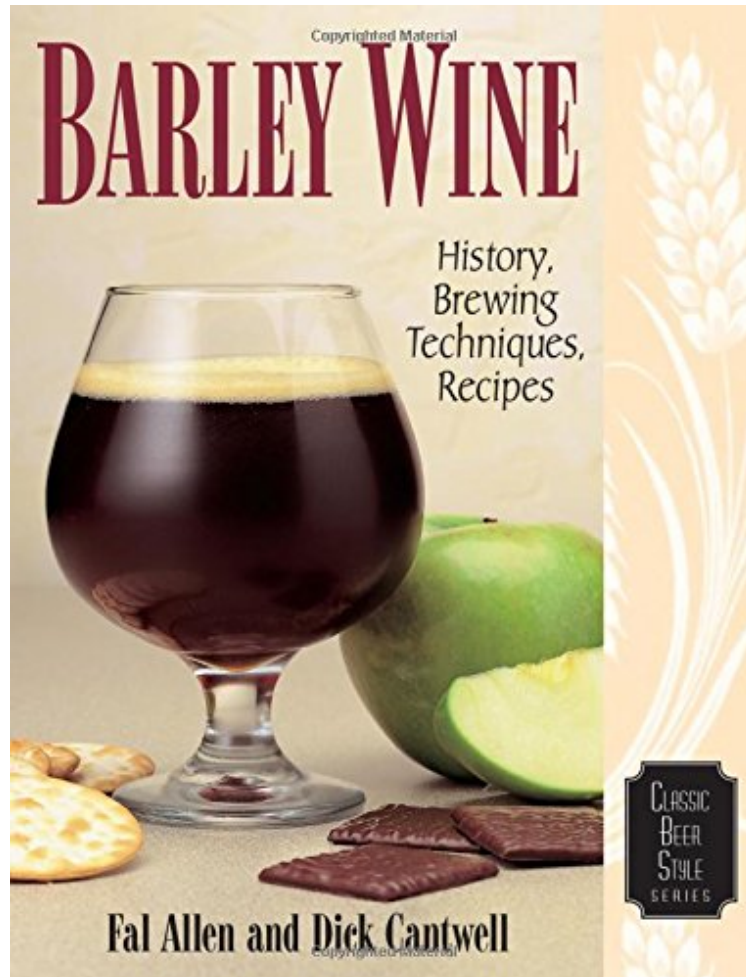

He has been a beer judge at the Great American Beer Festival for many years and has judged several times at the bi-annual World Beer Cup.
