DisappointedBy AndrewI liked the concept of this book, so I pre-ordered it several months ago.I finally got around to looking through it last night and I'm disappointed. I went through the book and made a tally of how many recipes called for mixes and how many were from scratch.63% of the recipes in this book call for boxed mixes (cake mix, baking mix, or cookie mix) while the other 37% of recipes are from scratch, with minimal store-bought ingredients.I was hoping it would be more of an even split, but: Some of the ideas are good, and most of the recipes that are from scratch are ones that I would try.Here's a run-down, chapter by chapter, of how many recipes feature mixes vs. homemade, from scratch.Recipes using mix / Recipes from scratchChapter 1 - Refrigerated/Frozen Desserts - 18 / 2Chapter 2 - Cakes - 21 / 12Chapter 3 - Bars Cookie Bars - 19 / 15Chapter 4 - Brownies - 7 / 7Chapter 5 - Slab Pies Crostatas - 11 / 2Chapter 6 - Candies - 4 / 8The biggest complaint I have about

this book has to do with the Cakes chapter. If you don't use the cake mix listed, you basically can't try the recipe. It would've been nice, in my opinion, if they could've included homemade cake batters that were the equivalent to the boxed cake mix listed, but that's just me. The book does include a "Master Scratch Dump Cake Mix" recipe, but it can only be used with the 4 variations of Dump Cakes listed. Plus, these "cakes" look more like cobblers and aren't that great to look at. Each chapter seems to focus on one store-bought ingredient as its base. For example, Chapter 1, Refrigerated/Frozen Desserts, uses a lot of cookie mix and softened ice cream. Chapter 2 uses a lot of cake mixes. Chapter 3, Bars and Cookie Bars, relies on cookie mix as a base for a lot of the bar recipes. Chapter 4, Brownies, call for boxed brownie mixes. Six of the 11 recipes in Chapter 5 call for refrigerated pie dough. This is the only chapter where it seems like you can swap store-bought with homemade without it affecting the recipe. A lot of the recipes in the final chapter call for boxed cereals, regardless of whether they're homemade or not. There's also a Metric Conversion Guide in the back of the book, but I'm not sure why since most of the recipes start with pre-measured mixes. It's an ok book, but probably not something I'm going to refer to regularly. I really like the concept, but there are just not enough homemade, from scratch recipes included. I don't regret buying it, though.
