By BethSI really only use this book for the muffin recipes, since I haven't really been tempted by most of the cookie, brownie or other recipes. I use this book fairly frequently, but right now, I'm just mad. I tried the Chocolate-Raspberry Muffins recipe this morning. When I put it into the muffin cups, I noticed the texture was a little weird and the cups didn't fill as high as usual. It wasn't until the muffins were half-way baked that I realized that there was no sugar in the recipe. By then it was too late, and there was no way to

recover. When I noticed that the Apple-Walnut Muffins recipe had no walnuts, it was no big deal. I noticed before I put them in the oven, and I wrote the correction into the ingredients list. But missing sugar? The other recipe that is a problem is the Banana-Walnut recipe. It doesn't have nearly enough banana, so the muffins are a little dry and not banana-y enough. I tried doubling the banana and reducing the oil and that helped some.
