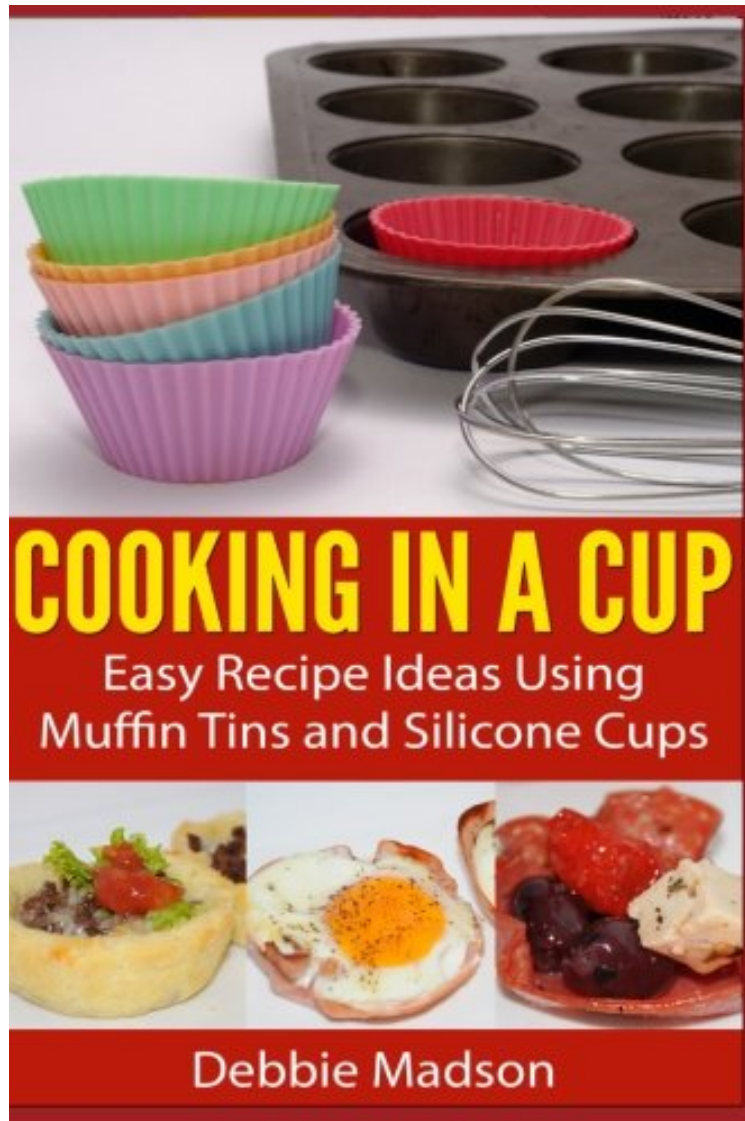

The recipes are basic. Cheeseburger cups simply say to make a crust, put in cup. Put in ground beef. Top with cheese and other fixings. That would be gross because 1) you would want the ground beef somewhat seasoned and 2) kids wouldn't know if she meant cooked or uncooked ground beef. Not to mention that a crust with ground beef on it likely would not taste that good, no matter how much cheese you throw on it. The recipes are a good baseline for kids with parents who will cook with them to help fill in the gaps. Some of these recipes, just by looking at them, will need other seasonings to improve taste. We love seasonings in my house! I like this book because I at least have a start and then I can choose to improve upon all the recipes as I see fit. I didn't know where to start. My children got baking cups and cookbooks in their stocking and they both love this book because they love the Idea of helping make meals!
